
2024 AsMA Fellows Scholarship Winners Announced

The 1st and 2nd place winners are selected by the AsMA Fellows Scholarship Committee based on the highest scientific value, originality, quality, and relevance of the applicant's presentation and AMHP manuscript related to the field of aerospace medicine (including allied scientific disciplines). Special consideration is given to those applicants who are at an early stage in their career development. The scholarship monetary awards are used for the purpose of underwriting, in whole or in part, the cost of registration fees, transportation, hotel accommodations, or any other valid fees or expenses incurred by the winners in relation to their attendance at one or more scholarly meetings on topics related to aerospace medicine.
